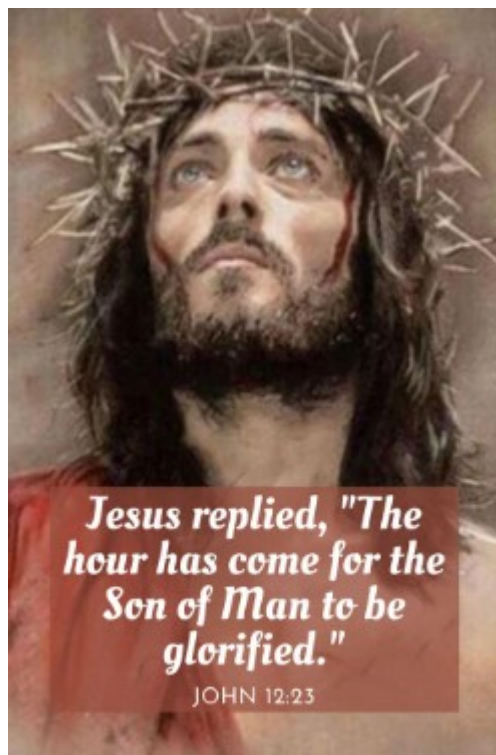

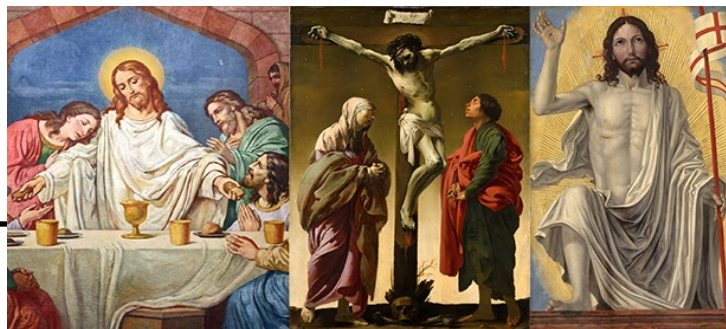
Chrism Mass



Each year the local bishop blesses enough new oils for every parish during the Chrism Mass. The holy oils are then brought to individual parishes, where they are available for use during that year. Though the bishop cannot be physically present at every baptism or confirmation in his diocese, he can be symbolically present through the holy oils he blesses.

After the Liturgy of the Word, the blessing of the oils takes place. In a formal procession, olive oil is brought forward in special urns; the oil of the sick is presented first, next the oil of the catechumens, and finally oil for the holy chrim. The bishop prays over and blesses each oil individually. The ritual for creating and consecrating the holy chrim is different from the others. To make it, the bishop mixes oil from the balsam plant with the olive oil, breathes on the mixed oil to signify the presence of the Holy Spirit, and then says a prayer to consecrate it. Once blessed in this way, the chrim and the other oils are no longer ordinary ointments. Instead, they are a holy, precious gift from God to the Church, signifying cleansing and strengthening, healing and comfort, and the life-giving grace of the Holy Spirit.

Since the bishop is the only minister in the diocese who may consecrate chrim, this Mass highlights his ministry and our union with him as a successor of the apostles. He will not baptize and confirm everyone in the parishes of the diocese, but he will be symbolically present in the chrim which the priests and deacons will use. This Mass also acknowledges the ministry of priests. It invites them to renew their commitment of service and to receive the prayers and support of the people. The Mass of Chrim gathers the faithful of the diocese at their mother church, the cathedral, with their shepherd to prepare for celebrations of Christ in all our churches throughout the year.
